The sweeter side: Cranberry-Orange Bars

- 3 Cups fresh or frozen cranber-
- 2 large unpeeled oranges, cut into quarters and seeded
- 2.5 cups sugar
- 3 tablespoons cornstarch
- 1 teaspoon ground ginger
- 1/2 cup (optional) chopped nuts Crust:
- 3 1/4 cups all-purpose flour
- 3/4 cup sugar
- 1 tablespoon grated lemon peel
- 1 cup cold butter
- 3 egg yolks

- 3/4 teaspoon vanilla extract
- 1-2 tablespoons water

First, grind cranberries & oranges (including peel.) Set aside. saucepan, combine sugar, cornstarch, and ginger. Add ground fruit; bring to a boil. Reduce heat, cook and stir for 15 min. or until thick. Remove from heat, stir in nuts set aside to cool.

For the crust, combine flour, sugar, and lemon peel in a large bowl. Cut in butter until coarse crumbs form. Add egg yolks, vanilla

and just enough water so dough holds it's shape. Pat two-thirds of dough into a greased 13"x9"x2" baking pan. Cover with cranberryorange mixture. Crumble remaining dough on the top.

Bake at 425 degrees for 20-25 minutes, or until the topping is golden brown. Allow to set to cool. Cut into bars. Yields approximately two and a half dozen average sized bars. They make great snacks, but can also be served for dessert. (Maybe with a little ice cream???)
